The American Flag

The American flag is an important symbol of the United States. No one knows for sure who made the very first American flag, but many people believe a woman named Betsy Ross sewed an early flag a long time ago, when our country was just getting started.

The flag was created to show that 13 groups of people, called colonies, were joining together to make one new country. Today, the American flag has 50 stars and 13 stripes. The stars stand for the 50 states, and the stripes stand for the 13 original colonies. The flag reminds us of freedom, bravery, and love for our country.



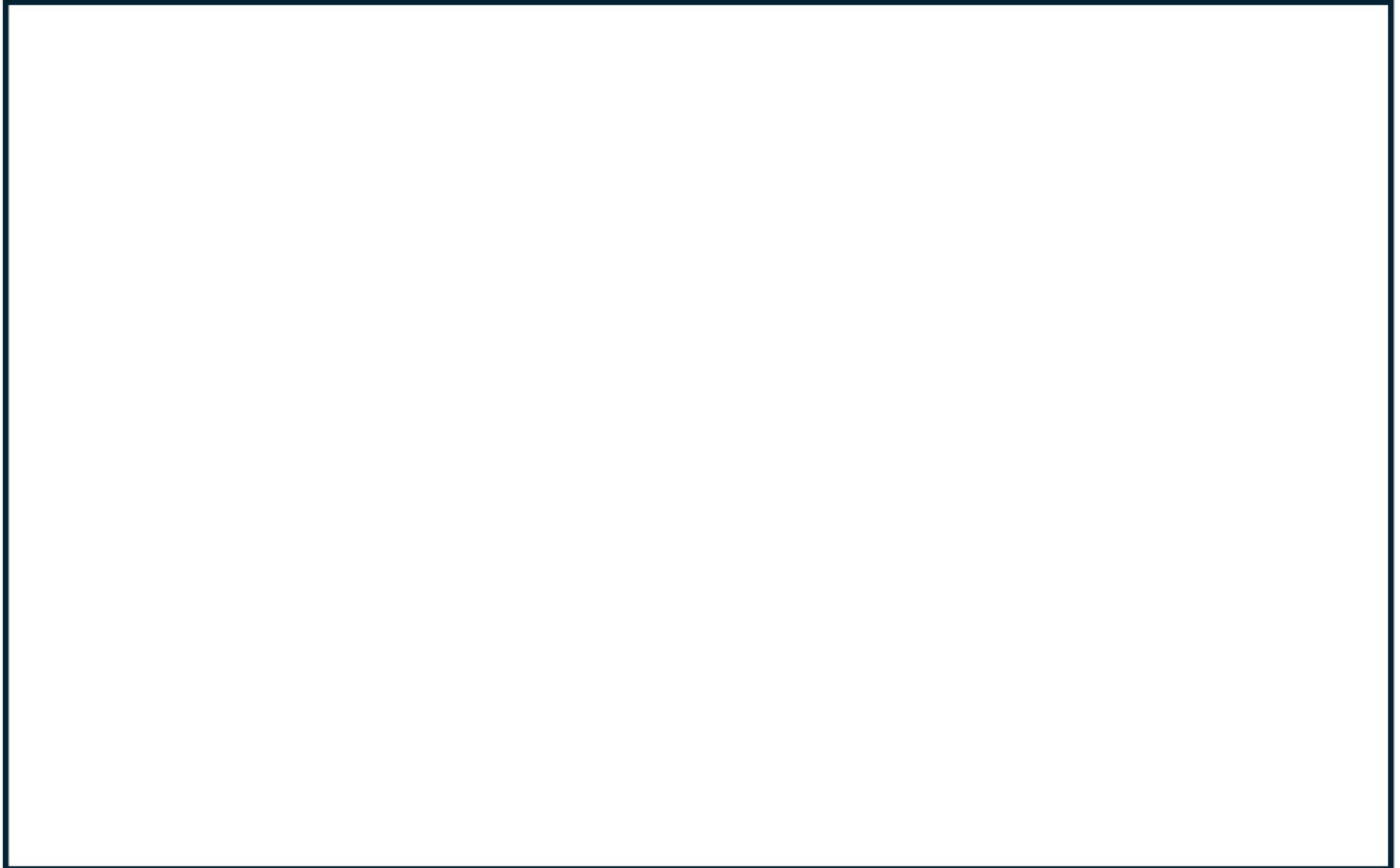

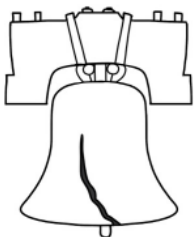
